



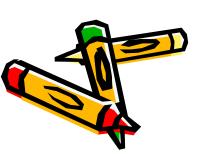
A Little About Me




Behavior Expectations

Behavior Clip Chart

I prefer to use a positive approach in dealing with student behavior.

To help guide the students with their choices, a colored scale is implemented. The scale will range from red(outstanding choices) to pink (poor choices).

The students will move their clip up or down the scale based on their classroom/school behavior. School wide.

Write Reminders for students (carline, activities etc.)


Stay at Home Pocket



Please have treats to school by noon if possible.




