

## Dear Parents,

Your child will be participating in the 4-H/Tropicana Public Speaking Program. Students will choose a topic that is of interest to them and write a speech on it at home. They will then present their speeches to their class on Tuesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>. Each classroom will have a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winner. The first place winners from each class will compete in the grade level wide contest on Thursday, April 19th. One winner from our grade level will be chosen to compete with other students from Sumter County on May 10th.

As this assignment will be completed at home, we are asking that each student work on it a little bit at a time and have final revisions on the written portion completed in plenty of time to practice actually giving the speech. Students must be careful to translate the written word into the spoken word on their index cards. For example, one should not say "follow me to the next paragraph", as it might be written.

Please be sure to encourage your child to select a topic that he or she is familiar with, or very interested in, as this will help the flow of the speech. Each portion of the speech has a deadline (topic due to teacher, plan sheet, written speech, index cards). All of these components will be scored and entered as an independent writing grade. The <u>written speech</u> will weigh more heavily on the final grade. When presenting the speech to the class, students should be using index cards or have the speech memorized.

## Grades that will be taken for this assignment:

The written portion of the speech, along with all of its components, will be taken as an independent writing grade.

The presentation of the speech will be taken as an ELA classwork grade.

## Students will be scored on:

*Composition* (topic, introduction, body, conclusion, length, language usage) *Presentation* (audience bond, delivery, pronunciation, articulation, volume, speed)

I know you will be very prepared and will do a wonderful job on Tuesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, when you give your speech in class. The winning student from each classroom will be invited to participate in the 4th Grade Level contest on Thursday, April 19<sup>th</sup>.

\*\*<u>Parents will be invited to attend the 4<sup>th</sup> grade level overall speech competition</u>, but unfortunately, the audience for the classroom speeches will be limited to judges only.
