

- a) Write the domain, in interval notation, of  $f(x) = e^{-x} 3$
- b) Write the range, in interval notation, of  $f(x) = e^{-x} 3$  (-3,  $\infty$ )
- c) Write the y-intercept, as an integer or simplified fraction, of  $f(x) = e^{-x} 3$ y-intercept -> x = 0 f(0) = €-3
- d) Write the horizontal asymptote, an equation, of  $f(x) = e^{-x} 3$







Suppose that the gross sales, S, in hundreds of dollars, of a certain product is given by the exponential function  $S(t)=5000(3^{-0.3t})$  where t is the number of weeks after the end of the campaign. Answer the following questions.
- a) What was the level of sales, round to the nearest whole number as needed, immediately after the end of the ad campaign when t = 0?  $S(o) = 5000(3^{\circ})$

b) What is the level of sales, round to the nearest whole number as needed, 1 week after the end of the advertising campaign?  $S(t) = 5000 \left(3^{-0.3(t)}\right)$ 

c) What is the level of sales, round to the nearest whole number as needed, 6 week after the end of the advertising campaign?  $5(6) = 5000 \left(3^{-1.8}\right)$   $= 5000 \left(3^{-1.8}\right)$
